

On May 6, 1840, the first stamps in England saw it thanks to the persistence of Rowland Hill, whose family name has become legendary. The Belgian Post sent an inspector, Louis Bronne, to our neighbors to study this new payment method. He therefore recommended that a lower uniform tax be collected, that the mail be ordered daily - actually in 1841 - and that the postal services be reorganized to cope with the constant increase in the volume of mail collected, transported and delivered. However, his first proposal feared that the financial losses would be too high and therefore the introduction was postponed. Nevertheless, the traders insisted that the whole of the mail should be taxed less, but above all in a uniform manner. After many interventions in parliament, the law was voted on December 24, 1847. Article 4 of this law provides for the use of stamps on missions. This was the start of a necessary reform to stimulate trade and industry, but also to enable people of modest rank to correspond with their families.

This important tariff reform of July 1, 1849 - publication date of the Royal Decree that determines the method of implementation of the law of December 24, 1847 - somewhat obscured the birth of the stamp. This reform was based on two main measures: - the simplification of the postage costs for letters: two distance and weight scales were used for the calculation: 10 centime if the distance between the office of origin and destination did not exceed 30 km and 20 centime for all other distances in the country. These rates remained valid until 1919. - the introduction of the postage in advance, with the logical consequence of the introduction of stamps. Previously, the letter post was met by the addressee. The use of stamps stimulated postal traffic. In 1839, the Belgian postal administration collected only 7,037,443 letters, or less than 2 per person. Two years after the reform, 9 million letters were counted and in 1860, 17.5 million letters were sent.

Of course this cannot be compared with the 3 billion pieces that were awarded in 1998. The manufacture of these two stamps was organized by Jacob Wiener (1815-1899), a driven engraver from the Rhineland who gained fame for his skill in engraving medals. However, it was an employee of the English firm Perkins & Bacon, Robinson, gravure engraver of book illustrations and portraits, who engraved the mother plate and the then very popular painter of Brussels descent, Charles Baugniet, who drew the portrait of the king. The printing took place in a workshop, installed in one of the outbuildings of the old Brussels railway station (Greendreef), according to the Engraving technique.


