

### New postage values

Since October 1st, the value of postage stamps for domestic mail is no longer indicated in euros. Instead of the value, you will find the number 1, 2, 3, 5, or 7 in a circle on the stamp. This number represents the base rate (currently €0.52) or multiples thereof. In concrete terms, this means:



Non-standard shipment for domestic use 0 - 100 gr

Non-standard shipment for domestic use 100 - 350 gr

Non-standard shipment for domestic use 350gr - 1kg

Non-standard shipment for domestic use 1kg - 2kg

Non-standard shipment for domestic di

### International postage at multiples of the basic rate

The new postage system is now also available for your foreign correspondence.

MULTIPLE franking for domestic mail has been a success. The rate structure is more transparent, and stamps remain fully valid after a rate change. The Post Office will extend this positive experience to international mail on January 1, 2009. The international rate system was simplified in February 2008 by abolishing non-priority mailing here as well. The way is now open to replace the values (e.g., 0.90) with multiples (e.g., 1).

To distinguish them from domestic rates (circled numbers), international multiples are placed in a square with rounded corners. For European destinations, this is displayed against the European flag. For "rest of the world," the number appears against the globe symbol.

#### In concrete terms this means:

symbol in the inventory	▶ 3	3	€ 2,40	Rate for a non-standard shipment within Europe 0 - 100gr
valuation of the	<b>&gt;</b> 1		€ 0,90	Basic rate for a standardized shipment for the rest of the world 0 - 50gr
stamps►	▶ 3	3	€ 2,70	Basic rate for a non-standard shipment for the rest of the world 0 - 100gr

If these rates change, the values on the stamps don't need to change. You can continue using your stock without having to add small denominations.

Philatelists can seamlessly integrate their "national" collection with their "international" stamp collection. Incidentally, all stamps issued after April 16, 1962, remain valid for postage.
